The Pastor's Pen

a word from Pastor Bill Davis

As Jesus approached Jerusalem and saw the city, he wept over it and said, "If you, even you, had only known on this day what would bring you peace! But now it is hidden from your eyes. The days will come upon you when your enemies will build an embankment against you and encircle you and hem you in on every side. They will dash you to the ground, you and the children within your walls. They will not leave one stone on another, because you did not recognize the time of God's coming to you."

Luke 19:41-44

This month we observe the season of Advent. The word *advent* means *coming* and Advent is a time to remember the first time Christ came to earth as a man and to look forward to his second coming. This past year, our gospel readings have focused on Luke and in the passage above we read of Christ's coming to Jerusalem at the conclusion of his first advent. Luke tells us that Christ wept because he knew the people would reject him. And, in so doing, they would reject God's offer of peace because Jesus himself is God's peace (Ephesians 2:14).

Upon visiting the Holy Land, the Spanish painter, Enrique Simonet, was inspired to paint the scene described by Luke. His masterpiece, *Flevit Super Illiam* (He Wept Over It) is below. Simonet depicts Jesus reaching out to the city—his posture one of longing rather than condemnation even as he pronounces judgment. "How often would I have gathered your children together as a hen gathers her brood under her wings, and you were not willing," Matthew, whose gospel we will focus on next year, remembers him saying (Matthew 23:37).

Jesus cried out to God's people, and to God on their behalf. When we pray for one another and seek God's peace, we are joining with the longing and prayers of Christ himself. This is a profound truth . . . this opportunity God gives us to pray along with our Savior. While God invites us to pray to him, in Christ, God is also praying for us. This realization inspired Paul to exalt: "Who then is the one who condemns? No one. Christ Jesus who died--more than that, who was raised to life--is at the right hand of God and is also interceding for us. Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? Shall trouble or hardship or persecution or famine or nakedness or danger or sword? . . . No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. For I am convinced that neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, neither the present nor the future, nor any powers, neither height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord" (Romans 8:34-35, 37-39). This conviction makes Simonet's painting powerfully relevant for every person, place, and time. Jesus is not merely extending his hands to Jerusalem; he is reaching out to us.

As we begin a new year, be encouraged knowing that no matter what may come, Jesus is always interceding for us, always reaching out to us with the peace of God. And let us commit to joining Christ--in our prayers, words and actions--in reaching out to our world.



Feeding the Flock

Three times Jesus asks Simon, "Simon, son of John, do you love me more than these?" "Yes, Lord, you know I love you". "Then feed my lambs.....take care of my sheep..... feed my sheep." John 21: 15-17.

Over the past month I have spent time reflecting on the ways that our ministry feeds the people we serve.

When the government shut down and it was announced that SNAP (Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) benefits would be slashed, I told Sandy that we would most likely see an increase in the number of people coming to the pantry. In fact, we have seen several new people and old friends returning more frequently for food supplies. We have also noticed that many of our lunch bag recipients are in need of extra food. There have also been some newcomers to the bag lunch program.

We continue to be blessed with an abundance of shelf stable foods in addition to some meat, milk and eggs. God is definitely watching over us. Earlier this month, we were recipients of about 650 pounds of food donated by the Ocean Waves Quilt Guild from their Lunch with a Purpose. We also received a monetary donation from them that will help us to purchase items like eggs and meat. We were also surprised by extra meat from Reid Farms when two other pantries were closed without notice on delivery day. **Actual food is just one of the ways that we feed people.**

Each Monday before we go out to deliver lunches, we gather for prayer. We ask for wisdom to deal with all situations we might encounter as well as for the people we serve. We also support each other in prayer. Being united like this allows us to minister to people's spiritual needs. We have given out testaments and have been asked for Bibles and prayers. **Being able to interact with these people every week allows us to nurture relationships and sometimes offer hope when things seem bleak.**

Our freezer is filled to overflowing, due to the generosity of all those who answered the call to provide soup and desserts. **The kitchen will be closed the Wednesday before Thanksgiving as well as Christmas Eve and New Year's Eve.**

Family Assistance

We have continued to receive requests for assistance with utilities and rent. They don't seem to be as frequent but working with Love, INC helps us make wise decisions.

Record Harvest For Conley's Vegetable Garden In 2025!

We had a record harvest for Conley's Vegetable Garden this past summer which was utilized each week by Cheryl Wood and others to feed the needy through Feeding the Flock.



- A total of **670 tomatoes (mostly Roma tomatoes)** and **650 pole and bush beans!**



- A total of **230 peppers, 110 cucumbers, and 57 squash (mostly yellow squash).**



- And **12 broccoli/cauliflower heads, 30 spinach, 15 honeydew** and **12 bags of basil.**

Traditionally December is thought to be the month for giving and going the extra mile. That is what your Thrift Shop has been doing these past couple of months. We have had the opportunity to go the extra mile for several individuals and families. We recently saw a gentleman that had nothing but his clothing. He had recently relocated to this area and was living in a motel. He had obtained a job and was working full time. With some assistance, he found an apartment that came available on a short notice. Conley's was able to fully furnish his 1 bedroom apartment including household items and linens for his bed. He came to see us on a Tuesday afternoon and our guys delivered his furniture on Friday. We have a fantastic couple (Joan and Rich) that has volunteered with us for several years. They take care of 2 of our sheds keeping them stocked and cleaned/organized. Through-out the year as they sort and tag the toys, they save all new toy donations that are given to us. We were able to donate a large tub of plush toys to help Camp Hope with their Christmas gifts and 2 tubs of games and other toys to our Angel Tree gift project. This past Saturday we had a family show up at the Thrift Shop asking for assistance with Christmas gifts for their family. There were several older children, an 8 year old and an infant. They left the shop with over 30 pieces of clothing, several pairs of shoes, toys and games for the children. This is just several examples of the opportunities that come our way. Sally and I want to give a great big thank you to our drivers, Richard Q. and Gary K. They took our truck to a charity event for Lunch With A Purpose in early November and picked up over 650 pounds of canned goods and shelf staple products for our Food Panty. Ocean Waves Quilters Guild were host for the event and chose our Church to receive the food donations. (two of our church ladies, Judy Parson and Louise Finn are members of the Quilter's Guild). Richard Q. also did the Mountaire Thanksgiving dinner pickup of 75 boxes for food and roaster chickens for Conleys to give to local families in need. Thanks again guys. It is a pleasure working with you and Rich W. also. You make our jobs easier. If you haven't been to the Thrift Shop recently, you need to stop by. Dale Tulloch is doing our Christmas Shed this year and it is full to the brim with great decorative items and oodles of Christmas trees and greenery. Prices are really affordable!!! Bring a friend and check it out. The new pole barn is in a holding pattern. There were several issues to work out regarding our permit process. One being the connection to the county's sewer system. There was a meeting on site at the shop 2 weeks ago and we are waiting on the final dollar numbers for the connection. Hopefully more news after the first of the year. Our staff and volunteers would like to wish each of you a very Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year.

Did you know that Paul after his conversion spent three years in the desert to be taught by the Holy Spirit. He also experienced many hardships, such as shipwrecks and imprisonment, that could be considered "wilderness" or desert experiences.

Several figures in the Bible had wilderness experiences, including Moses, the Israelites, Jesus, John the Baptist, as well as the Apostle Paul. These periods in the wilderness often involved hardship and testing, but also served as a time for preparation, instruction, and transformation.


It is said that a **"desert experience" represents a period of spiritual struggle and growth or a spiritual journey of waiting in a place of hardship**, like a desert. Haven't you been through at least one period of hardship, or desert experience, in your life?

Much of what we observe in our lives has the potential to become material for a devotional, so **consider keeping a journal for ideas, thoughts, and feelings**. For example, when did God make Himself known to you in a dramatic way? **Did you receive an answer to prayer regarding a health issue, financial need, or spiritual awakening that proved God was working in your life?"**

But it's up to you how the 2026 edition of Conley's Lenten devotional ends up. As in 2025 I am open to you contributing something as simple as a Lenten-related picture or artwork, or a Lenten-related prayer, favorite hymn or personal testimony. It's up to you!
